at around 7:10 am. It definitely getting lighter, and it won't be long before we are in the midst of spring and summer! It's amazing how quickly the time goes...


Just a reminder that school closes for half-term today (Friday 9th February) and re-opens to everyone one at normal time on Monday 19th February.

ATTENDANCE/ PUNCTUALITY

Please ensure your child arrives to school on time for registration.

The school gates are open from 8.30am till 8.40am. All children should be in class by 8.40am.

Arriving to school on time is important for your child so they don't miss important introductions to the lesson. Please make sure every effort is made to ensure that your child/ren arrive on time.

Any absences from school must be reported on the school spider app or the school answerphone each day of your child's absence .

EXTENDED LEAVE

Please refer to our Discretionary Leave Policy (available on the website) for further information and clarity around taking your child out of school during term time. Please be aware that parents who take their child/ren away in school time may be issued with a penalty notice, or may be removed from the school roll. All planned and unplanned leave must be discussed in advance, with Mrs Rehman.

APPOINTMENTS

Routine health appointments are better made out of school hours or during holidays. We are aware that this is not always possible, and request for appointments to be made at time where there is minimal disruption to your child's learning. The school office should be notified as soon as possible of appointments, and shown appointment letters, cards or text messages.



School Reading Books

We hope that everybody is enjoying school's reading books that we have invested heavily in. Please continue to read regularly with your children and discuss what has been read. Asking questions will help to develop understanding, comprehension and enjoyment. Please remember to read daily and sign reading records.

These have included damaged and ripped pages as well as being damaged by getting wet. We would like to remind that we do not wish to fine parents and carers for damaged books as we want children to read and enjoy without limitations but there will be future charges for repeated damaged books.


