



Dear Parents/Guardians,

This is always an exciting time of year as we start to think about all of the adventures we will share over the year. Last year saw us smash records with our children reaching new heights in both the multiplication check in Year 4 and in the Year 6 SATS. I am sure we can do even better this year!

I thought I would update you on some the things that have been going on over the summer. You may have noticed the roads around school have been resurfaced as part of the local authority's planned maintenance work. In addition, we have received funding to upgrade our fire alarm system in Key Stage 2 — which may not sound very exciting, but it is far superior to our old system and contributes to keeping everybody safe.

We have also been working hard to set up our new extended wrap-around care. You will have received information about how to book your child into our breakfast and after-school clubs. This is a trial year. We would love to keep the after-school club running indefinitely. Unfortunately, if we do not get the uptake

required to be able to keep it going, we will have to stop offering it next academic year. We have been fortunate to have received additional funding to help support this trial this year but to keep it going, we will need to be able to cover the cost of staffing it without this additional help — so please, consider using our after-school facility! We're cheaper than other providers and private child minders!

Whilst I have been out of school today, I was thrilled with how considerately parents parked on our first day back! We had even forgotten to put out the cones and yet nearly all of you avoided parking on Earl Street outside the entrance and on the yellow lines! This made it so much safer for your children! So, thank you! Hopefully, we can keep this up as the winter draws in!

New Breakfast and After-School Club Guidance

We're pleased to announce that from Wednesday 3rd September 2025 our wraparound childcare provision for school aged children is expanding to include a **7:00am start for Breakfast Club**, as well as an **After-School Club running until 5:00pm**.

How to Book and Pay:

- Booking and payment will be managed through the **School Spider app**. Payments are made securely online at the time of booking.
- You can book sessions for Breakfast Club (7:00am 8:35am) £2.50 per session, and/or After-School Club (3:05pm 5:00pm) £7.50 per session. If your child is entitled to pupil premium the may attend for free.
- Bookings must be made at least 1 school day in advance to help us plan staffing, consumables and activities.

If you need help accessing School Spider or making a booking, please contact the school office.

Important Information:

- Breakfast Club and After school club must now be booked in advance this means that the old drop in system no longer applies.
- Cancellation policy You can cancel your booking up to 1 school day before your chosen session to avoid being charged.
- Late collections after 5:00 pm will incur an additional fee.
- If a child is <u>not collected on time at the end of the school day</u> (3:05pm for school and 3:10pm for nursery), they will be taken to After-School Club for supervision, and you will be charged the full session fee



Wraparound care Pricing Policy

Session timings and fees:

Breakfast Club (7:00am – 8:35am): £2.50 per session After-School Club (3:05pm – 5:00pm): £7.50 per session

These sessions are free of charge for children entitled to pupil premium.

Payment Terms:

All payments must be made online via the School Spider app at the time of booking. Late or non-payment may result in withdrawal of wraparound care places.

Additional Charges:

Late collection fee: £5.00 per 15 minutes after 5:00 pm.

Wraparound Booking Terms and Conditions

- 1. Booking and Payment
 - All bookings must be made in advance through the School Spider platform.
 - Payment is due at the time of booking to confirm your child's place.
- 1. Booking Deadline
 - Bookings must be made at least 1 school day before the session starts.
- 1. Cancellations
 - Cancellations must be made at least 1 school day before the session.
 - Late cancellations or no-shows will be charged in full.
- 1. Late Collection
 - Children must be collected by 5:00pm.
 - A late fee of £5.00 per 15 minutes will be charged for late pickups.
- 1. Uncollected Pupils from school or nursery
 - If a child is **not collected on time at the end of the school day (3:05pm for school and 3:10pm for nursery)**, they will be taken to After-School club for supervision and **you will be charged the full session fee**.
- 1. Behaviour
 - The school's behaviour policy applies during wraparound sessions.
 - Persistent disruptive behaviour may result in loss of wraparound care privileges.
- 1. Health and Safety
 - Parents must inform staff of any allergies or medical conditions at the time of booking, please call the main school office.
 - Staff follow all school safeguarding and health & safety policies.
- 1. Changes to Provision
 - The school reserves the right to alter session times, prices, and policies with notice.







Here to help you juggle family life

Childcare Choices



How to get your code

- Visit ChildcareChoices.gov.uk to check your eligibility.
- 2 Speak to your provider to understand their arrangements and to see if they can offer your child a place.
- 3 Apply for your code online.
 You'll need your National
 Insurance number (or
 unique taxpayer reference if
 self-employed), the date you
 started or are due to start work,
 details of any government
 support or benefits you receive,
 and your child's UK birth
 certificate reference number
 (if available).
- 4 Give your code to your provider. You may find out if you're eligible straight away, but it can take up to 7 days to get your code.
- 5 Reconfirm your details on your childcare account every 3 months.

Application deadlines

To get your 30 hours childcare code, apply by:

- 31 August 2025 to use it from 1 September 2025.
- 31 December 2025 to use it from 1 January 2026.
- 31 March 2026 to use it from 1 April 2026.

You can find out using the eligibility checker on our website. Simply scan the QR code or search 'Childcare Choices'.

Using your childcare hours

- If you meet the criteria, you can start using your hours the term after your child reaches the right age. Terms start on 1 January, 1 April, and 1 September.
- Check or update your details every 3 months to keep getting your childcare hours. Don't worry, you'll get a reminder when it's time.
- You can use your hours alongside other schemes like Tax-Free Childcare or Universal Credit Childcare. You can mix and match between nurseries, childminders and pre-schools.
- You may be asked to pay for certain optional additional services on top of your entitlement hours, although these must not be a condition of accessing your governmentfunded place. Speak to your provider for more information.
- Different providers might have their own rules for using childcare hours. Check that their hours work for you.

Current Year 2 Transition to Year 3 (KS2)

Next term, your child will be moving into Year 3 (Key Stage 2). This is the transition from the infant part of the school to the juniors.

As your child moves into Year 3 there are some changes we need to make you aware of.

Please remember your child's entitlement to Universal Infant Free School Meals expired at the end of Year 2 and meals must be paid for in advance via School Spider, at a cost of £2.60 per meal. If you believe you may be entitled to free school meals, due to your financial circumstances, please ensure you apply as soon as possible. https://www.blackburn.gov.uk/schools-and-education/school-meals

Parents will continue to be able to book their child's meal on a termly basis, which allows your child their choice of meals. If a meal is not pre-booked your child will be receive the Kitchen Choice for the day.



School Meals - Charges from September 2025

We would like to advise that from Wednesday 3rd September 2025 there will be a price increase to the cost of school meals. School meals will increase to £2.60 per day for a nutritionally balanced two-course meal would still proves excellent value for money. We continue to work closely with LCC who provide the catering service and have taken their advice with the price increase but still remained lower than their recommended charge per meal. They continue to offer an exciting and varied range of meals which are both healthy and nutritious. All of the menus are developed in line with the nutritional standards which meets the government food standards and gives value for money.

There will be no impact for KS1 children who receive the government funded Universal Infant Free School meal offer, or our students in receipt of Free School Meals.
