A child CANNOT take up a new place in a Grace period

If a child attended your provision last term and have entered their grace period they will be funded for the Autumn Term and MUST reconfirm before 31<sup>st</sup> December to be eligible for Spring

If you would like any codes validating by the team - please send through the parental eligibility Validation form, these children will be added to your headcount for you

# **Applying for a Primary school place**

You must apply for a primary school place a year before your child can start school. The school starting age is 4.

Your child will be 3 or have just turned 4 when you apply.

Applications open in September each year and close on 15 January 2026.

# **Applying for a Secondary school place**

Applications usually open on 1 September 2025. You must apply for a secondary school place by 31 October 2025

Your child is less likely to be offered a place at their chosen schools if you miss the deadline for applications.

#### How to get your code

- Visit ChildcareChoices.gov.uk to check your eligibility.
- 2 Speak to your provider to understand their arrangements and to see if they can offer your child a place.
- 3 Apply for your code online.
  You'll need your National
  Insurance number (or
  unique taxpayer reference if
  self-employed), the date you
  started or are due to start work,
  details of any government
  support or benefits you receive,
  and your child's UK birth
  certificate reference number
  (if available).
- 4 Give your code to your provider. You may find out if you're eligible straight away, but it can take up to 7 days to get your code.
- 5 Reconfirm your details on your childcare account every 3 months.

# **Application deadlines**

To get your 30 hours childcare code, apply by:

- 31 August 2025 to use it from 1 September 2025.
- 31 December 2025 to use it from 1 January 2026.
- 31 March 2026 to use it from 1 April 2026.



## See what support you could get

You can find out using the eligibility checker on our website. Simply scan the QR code or search 'Childcare Choices'.

## Using your childcare hours

- If you meet the criteria, you can start using your hours the term after your child reaches the right age. Terms start on 1 January, 1 April, and 1 September.
- Check or update your details every 3 months to keep getting your childcare hours. Don't worry, you'll get a reminder when it's time.
- You can use your hours alongside other schemes like Tax-Free Childcare or Universal Credit Childcare. You can mix and match between nurseries, childminders and pre-schools.
- You may be asked to pay for certain optional additional services on top of your entitlement hours, although these must not be a condition of accessing your governmentfunded place. Speak to your provider for more information.
- Different providers might have their own rules for using childcare hours. Check that their hours work for you.

## Year 3

This week we have all completed a Star Reading Test and we will be bringing new books home to read with our grown ups at least 3 times per week. In music we have learnt to play notes b, a and g on the recorder while in RE we have written songs about Harvest time. In maths we have been finding 1, 10 or 100 more and less than a given number, and also finding numbers on a number line. In English we enjoyed researching animal facts on the iPads so we could use them in letters we wrote as Green peace. We have practised passing, pivoting with, and shooting a netball and also learnt the names of five more animals in French.

# Year 4

Year 4 have had a brilliant week this week. In English we have been writing an innovated fantasy story following the structure of 'Captain Underpants' In Maths we have been rounding a 4 digit number to the nearest, 10, 100 and 1000. We have completed our Place Value topic and will be starting our new topic of Addition and Subtraction next week.

### Year 5

Year 5 have been working incredibly hard this week! In Maths, we've been using a range of mental strategies to tackle tricky 4-digit addition, building both confidence and accuracy in our calculations. In English, we had great fun rewriting the exciting archery scene from Outlaw by Michael Morpurgo, showing off our creativity and descriptive skills. In PE, our focus has been on stamina and health, as we challenge ourselves to keep improving our fitness and resilience.

# Year 6

Well done to 6H for their fantastic Parent Worship this week! The children spoke clearly, performed confidently, and shared their learning beautifully. Thank you to all the families who came to support them! This week in Year 6, the children have continued to show great enthusiasm and focus in their learning. In Maths, we've been exploring factors, multiples, and prime numbers, using a range of strategies to identify patterns and solve problems. The children have enjoyed applying their knowledge to challenging tasks and developing their reasoning skills. In English, we've continued reading our class novel Skellig. The children have been using inference to delve deeper into the characters' thoughts, feelings, and motives. It's been fantastic to hear such thoughtful discussions and see the children backing up their ideas with evidence from the text. We've also begun planning our very own flashback stories, focusing on using structure and language to create atmosphere and emotion. The children have come up with some wonderfully imaginative ideas, and we're excited to see these stories come to life in the coming week.

# Action

"Please ensure that your child arrives at school on time each day. Even a few minutes late can mean missing out on important parts of their learning and daily routines. Homework is set on Century each week and should be completed by Wednesday morning. Thank you for supporting your child in staying on top of their tasks.
