Dear Parents/Guardians,

You will have no doubt heard a lot in the news recently about the importance of attendance at school and the link between being in school and achieving more in later life.

Recently, we have seen an increase in requests for leave or, even worse, parents taking children out of school without even notifying us.

I want to be clear about the rules on this. I **cannot** authorise holidays to everyone who wants to take one. Regardless of my views on flight prices etc, my responsibility is to ensure your children do as well as they can whilst in our care.

Our policy has always been very clear and very consistent. We do not authorise leave during the school term – except in absolutely exceptional circumstances.

This means that the majority of parents taking their children out of school without authorisation from us will be fined. And the fines are per parent per child! So they can really add up.

We don't want to be issuing fines to anyone – everyone has got enough going

on as it is to be worrying about paying fines to the Local Authority. But the easiest way to avoid this is to just to take your child abroad or on holiday during the 13 weeks of school holidays every year. You won't get fined, but more importantly, your child will be more settled at school, develop stronger friendships and achieve more than if they are constantly having to readjust.

So, as we head towards winter and the colder months, please plan your holidays for our holiday dates, keep your child in school and avoid paying fines to the LA!

I look forward to seeing a dramatic decrease in children going on extended leave over this academic year!

Applying for a Primary school place

You must apply for a primary school place a year before your child can start school. The school starting age is 4.

Your child will be 3 or have just turned 4 when you apply.

Applications open in September each year and close on 15 January 2026.

Applying for a Secondary school place

Applications usually open on 1 September 2025. You must apply for a secondary school place by 31 October 2025

Your child is less likely to be offered a place at their chosen schools if you miss the deadline for applications.

How to get your code

- Visit ChildcareChoices.gov.uk to check your eligibility.
- 2 Speak to your provider to understand their arrangements and to see if they can offer your child a place.
- 3 Apply for your code online.
 You'll need your National
 Insurance number (or
 unique taxpayer reference if
 self-employed), the date you
 started or are due to start work,
 details of any government
 support or benefits you receive,
 and your child's UK birth
 certificate reference number
 (if available).
- 4 Give your code to your provider. You may find out if you're eligible straight away, but it can take up to 7 days to get your code.
- 5 Reconfirm your details on your childcare account every 3 months.

Application deadlines

To get your 30 hours childcare code, apply by:

- 31 August 2025 to use it from 1 September 2025.
- 31 December 2025 to use it from 1 January 2026.
- 31 March 2026 to use it from 1 April 2026.

You can find out using the eligibility checker on our website. Simply scan the QR code or search 'Childcare Choices'.

Using your childcare hours

- If you meet the criteria, you can start using your hours the term after your child reaches the right age. Terms start on 1 January, 1 April, and 1 September.
- Check or update your details every 3 months to keep getting your childcare hours. Don't worry, you'll get a reminder when it's time.
- You can use your hours alongside other schemes like Tax-Free Childcare or Universal Credit Childcare. You can mix and match between nurseries, childminders and pre-schools.
- You may be asked to pay for certain optional additional services on top of your entitlement hours, although these must not be a condition of accessing your governmentfunded place. Speak to your provider for more information.
- Different providers might have their own rules for using childcare hours. Check that their hours work for you.

Year 6

"This week in Year 6, we have been learning all about prime numbers and long multiplication. We discovered that prime numbers are special because they only have two factors, 1 and themselves, with 2 being the only even prime number! In English, the children have been developing their writing skills in English by completing a character description based on Skellig.
