English

Our fictional text this half term is Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo. We will read the text in class and independently answer comprehension questions based upon the text following the VIPERS structure. Our writing task will be writing a newspaper article.

Our non-fiction text is a 'Rainforest Rough Guide,' by Paul Mason, and children will explore the features of an information booklet, and create their own.

The Tyger is the poem that we will be studying this half term, with the children paying close attention to the figurative language used throughout.


Maths

In Maths this half term, Year 5 will be studying decimals. The pupils will be building on their previous knowledge of place value to be able to add and subtract numbers in the tenths, hundredths and thousands column. They will begin by looking at numbers below 1 before using whole numbers as well. To end this topic, Year 5 will then look at multiplying and dividing decimals by 10, 100 and 1000.

In the end of the term, the pupils will focus on geometry. This will include using a protractor to identify the angles of a shape, on a straight line and from a point.

Science

In Science this half term, we will be studying the topic of 'Living things and their habitats'. The pupils will learn about a range of different classifications of animals and plants developing their knowledge of their reproduction processes and lifecycles.



Modern Foreign Language—French

Our topic this half term is 'Transport' children will continue to practise a range of French pronouns, in order to begin to structure their own sentences in French.

P.S.H.E.

In PSHE this half term Year 5 will be continuing learning about family life and the different relationship within families. This topic themes will focus upon marriage and what that means. We will also be looking at discrimination and stereotypes looking at challenging negative behaviours.

History

In history we will be looking at the Ancient Greeks. The pupils will first take a look at where and how the Ancient Greeks lived, delving into the similarities and differences from then and now. This will lead onto researching how we know so much about them and how their civilisation has shaped our modern society.



P.E.

In P.E. this half term children will be completing a range of Athletic activities. Children will continue to develop a range of athletic specific skills and perform them with consistency, accuracy, confidence, control and speed. Children will pay close attention to throwing, jumping, running and passing a baton in relay. We understand that some children will be fasting, so stations will be carefully adapted for those children.


R.E.

This half term we will be looking at 'Holy Books of other religions' in RE. We will recap learning of the Bible from Autumn term before diving deeper into other religions. The main focus of learning will be focused upon the Vedas used in the Hindu religion.



Geography

In Geography this half term, children will be comparing settlements in Europe, South America and the UK. Children will be able to describe three similarities and three differences between land use and climate zones in Sweden, the UK and Peru. Children will be able to explain how that the latitude position affects how much light a country gets a day.



Art

Children will be looking at 'Flora and Fauna,' paying close attention to the global artists Henri Rousseau, the French post-impressionist painter and comparing the art work and style of Ruth Daniels, whose art-work is inspired by the Caribbean.



Music

In Music this half term, children will continue to listen to and appraise a range of different music from memory for a different range of styles and types of songs.

Computing

This term pupils will be looking at how to collect and present information using different computer systems. During this half-term children will be collecting data using a questionnaire and presenting their finding using Microsoft Excel.



D.T.

In D.T, the children will be learning about seasonal foods within the UK. This will cover a range of different food types such as fruit, vegetables, meat and dairy. Children will learn how and why different food only grow a certain types of the year.
