Swimming	£7172.00 £3745 per class	Enhance the current curriculum which allows all Year 5 pupils to take part in weekly swimming lessons all year. By extending swimming more children will achieve Expected standard in PE by the end of KS2. 4R, 3J, 3P – 1 term of 45-minute swimming lessons each. Evidence: increased number of children able to swim 25 m.		*	*	*			Up until March , children in Year 5 attended weekly swimming lessons. Children in Years 3 also attended weekly swimming sessions with children reporting an increase in confidence in water. Only 6% of pupils in Year 3 had experienced swimming lessons before. In Year 5, 95% of children required swimming aids at the beginning of the year. Only 7% required armbands at the end of the year, 51% required a swimming noodle and 30% of children could swim 25m unaided by the end of the year compared to 0% at the beginning of the year. Evidence: Attendance registers, Pupil Conferencing.
